Award: 1-12 Credits

Certificate: 13-36 Credits

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Mainstream Construction Training - Apprentice Frameworks

- Levels 1-4
- Taught Diploma eg *Level 3 Diploma* in Site Carpentry (Construction)
- Vocational, on-site assessment & training (OSAT) eg *L3 NVQ Diploma* in Wood Occupations (Construction)

Heritage Construction Training in Wales

- Level 3
- Vocational, on-site assessment & training (OSAT) eg Specialist Apprentice Programmes (SAPs) & Specialist Upskilling Programmes (SUPs)
- Intensive training with heritage experts (10 – 20 days)
- NVQ3 Diploma is the output, with *no separate taught qualification*.

Foundations In Heritage

- 50 students with NVQ 3 Qualification
- Plastering, Carpentry, Masonry
- 3 year HLF Skills for the Future Funding
- 1 year bursary
- Placements with Welsh heritage companies
- Training at the Tywi Centre



Building our Heritage

- 30 students on SAP - NVQ3
- Plastering, Masonry, Carpentry
- Wales wide, 2 year programme
- Partnership between Tywi Centre & the Natural Building Centre
- 1 year bursary
- Placements with Welsh heritage companies
- 10 women given basic craft skills training

Background

- *Programme for Government* commitment to introduce a Heritage Bill
- Extensive engagement in 2012
 - Horizon-scanning workshops
 - Open public events
 - Treftadaeth conference
- *Historic Environment Strategy for Wales*
- *The future of our past* – consultation in 2013
 - Supplementary consultation – March/April 2014



An integrated package of measures

- The Heritage Bill — 3 main objectives
 - To give more effective protection to listed buildings and scheduled ancient monuments
 - To enhance existing mechanisms for the sustainable management of the historic environment
 - To introduce greater transparency and accountability into decisions taken on the historic environment
- Complementary policy, advice and guidance



Next steps

- The Heritage Bill
 - Scheduled for introduction to the National Assembly for Wales in late spring 2015
- Planning policy and advice
 - Revision of *Planning Policy Wales*
 - New technical advice note (TAN) for the historic environment
- Additional Cadw guidance
 - World Heritage Sites; local lists; owner's manual for listed buildings
